Thank you for the opportunity to serve.

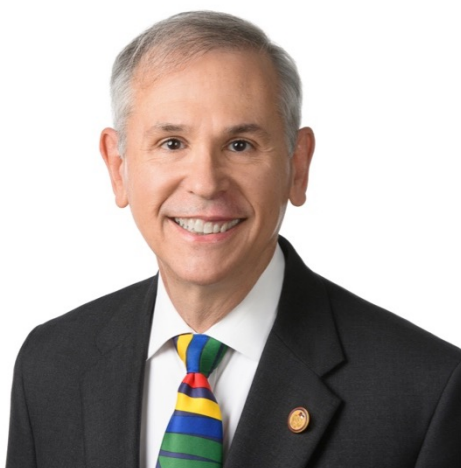

2025–2026 Accomplishments

The new council has been hard at work getting things done, including a lot of updating and modernizing the Section's operations.

First, the Section worked to sponsor and co-sponsor two CLE programs at the Texas Law Center in Austin:

- LGBTQ+ Legal Issues in Changing Times—December 18, 2025 and
- Bill of Rights 2026: Litigating the Constitution—May 8, 2026

We are also offering a full day of CLE programming has been planned during for the State Bar Annual Meeting in Houston on June 12, 2026.

Second, the Section remains committed to maintaining a visible statewide presence by participating in State Bar events supporting attorneys interested in establishing or revitalizing local LGBTQ+ affinity bars throughout Texas.

Third, we acquired a new domain and updated the Section website, transitioning to the name adopted in 2023 during our 25th anniversary year: LGBTQ+ Law Section. Our new website, <https://lgbtqpluslawtx.org>, reflects the modern identity and mission of the Section.

Fourth, we negotiated access for our members to *LGBT Law Notes*, available in the Members Only area of the website.

Fifth, we recognized people with the Judge Norman W. Black Award for the years 2021, 2023, 2024, and 2025.

Finally, we have redesigned our Section logo and acquired new membership pins and other items reflecting the Section's 2023 name change.

Judge Norman W. Black Award

The Judge Norman W. Black Award is given by the LGBTQ+ Law Section of the State Bar of Texas in memory of United States District Judge Norman W. Black to a past or present member of the State Bar of Texas for significant contributions to lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, and HIV law. The award is the highest honor presented by the LGBTQ+ Law Section of the State Bar of Texas and is presented in memory of United States District Judge Norman W. Black, who courageously supported the creation of the Section.



Judge Black (1931–1997) was nominated by President Carter, served on the United States District Court for the Southern District of Texas from 1979 to 1997, and served as chief judge from 1992 to 1996.

Judge Black publicly criticized the State Bar Board of Directors following the Board's 1996 vote denying the original petition to create a Gay and Lesbian Issues Section. His principled leadership and outspoken defense of equality inspired the founders of the Section to continue their efforts.

Beginning in 2000, the Section has presented the Judge Norman W. Black Award annually to past or present members of the State Bar of Texas for significant contributions to lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, and HIV law. Due in part to the COVID pandemic, no awards were made in 2021, 2023, 2024, and 2025. As part of the Section's ongoing efforts to preserve and honor the history of LGBTQ+ legal advocacy in Texas, the current council undertook efforts to identify distinguished individuals whose contributions merited recognition but had not been previously recognized. The council is proud to recognize these deserving recipients and ensure their contributions to the profession and community are appropriately honored and remembered.
